Johanna LeRoux - Threads of Life

When a serious injury or death happens in the workplace, it may show up in the news for a day or two, but then the news and the world quickly move on. Few people understand the ripple effects of a workplace tragedy. It not only affects the worker but also the close friends, extended family, community, and co-workers.

In 2006, Johanna LeRoux's life was permanently and profoundly altered by a workplace tragedy, caused by a working-at-heights hazard. Johanna will describe what happened and the impact the tragedy has had on her family. She delivers a profoundly moving reminder of why workplace safety is so important.

Johanna is a member of the Threads of Life volunteer speakers bureau. Threads of Life helps families affected by a workplace fatality, life-altering injury, or occupational disease along their journey of healing. They currently work with more than 2,300 family members from across Canada who have been affected by a workplace tragedy.

Breakout Session Topics

E4 and E6 Lanyards – Honeywell

- Demonstrate an understanding of the difference between E4 and E6 lanyards.
- Understand when each type of lanyard is required.
- Understand how drop distances change.
- Understand the repercussions of a heavier person using an E4 lanyard (rebound).

Fall Calculation and Drop Test – Honeywell

- Understand the difference between total fall distance (TFD) and actual clearance.
- Calculate the total fall distance.
- Recognize methods to limit fall distance and remain within actual clearance available (i.e. raise anchor point, select shorter lanyard or pick SRL style lanyard).

Fall Rescue – MSA

- Understand when a fall rescue is required (i.e. O. Reg. 213/91 26.1(4)).
- Understand different types of rescue systems.
- Understand the importance of rescue training (responsibilities of team, use of equipment, etc).

Assessing and Controlling Hazards – IHSA

- Identify actual and potential hazards and risk level (e.g., weather conditions).
- Understand provisions on the maintenance, use, and inspection of the equipment that is being used.
- Understand the need and methods to eliminate swing hazard.

Anchor Points – MSA

- Understand the difference between anchorage and anchor connectors.
- Understand the difference between temporary and permanent anchor points.
- Know the requirements for anchor points and how to tie off to them.

Distracted Driving – IHSA

- Rules and regulations that apply to company vehicles.
- The human element that affect ability to drive.
- How the vehicle and environment can affect the driver.
- Techniques to drive defensively.
